

THOSE WHO RECOGNISED JESUS HAD HARDLY ANY FAITH AT ALL!

Maybe the problem for most of us is that we have too much faith. What we call faith anyway. Perhaps it is not faith at all. We lay it on with a trowel in every circumstance of life. We drown ourselves in it. We have so much of our own version of so called faith that we cannot see anymore. The people who recognised Jesus had hardly any faith at all. They were the swindlers and the prostitutes. They were out of the game. They were the religious. There were those who were disqualified from competing in the real world through disability - the blind and the lame. Jesus could do business with all of them. This was not because Jesus felt sorry for them and wanted to give them a break. It was because their faith was the size of a mustard seed, only a mustard seed, but it served them better than those with faith the size of a mountain. The scribes and the Pharisees were rendered blind and immobile by their colossal faith. Their faith was so strong that it had become a handicap. The religious authorities could never recognise Jesus as the fulfilment of their promises. Never in a million years. He was an affront to all they stood for. To accept the simplicity of the GOOD NEWS would be to undermine their own position. Their energies went into maintaining their own brand of bad news. To

relinquish would be an admission that they had been wasting their time. Jesus had a spectacular success in the man born blind. The Pharisees sent for his parents. He was too naïve to speak for himself: "ALL I KNOW IS THAT I WAS BLIND AND NOW I CAN SEE". Who else but a simpleton would have asked the Pharisees. "DO YOU WANT TO BECOME ONE OF HIS DISCIPLES TOO?" The scribes and the Pharisees resented Jesus like mad. They resented the folksy simple manner that He spoke to the people. How could they be expected to fill their



synagogues if people were flocking to hear the carpenter's Son? And they refused to accept Him. Do you accept Jesus? If so what difference are you allowing Him to make in your life?
