

ADVENT - SEEK OUT A HIDDEN DESERT

I must admit that for a lot of my Priesthood I considered myself a Lent person more than an Advent person. I was more comfortable in the desert that in the midst of party preparations, but slowly, slowly as I got older I began to get closer to the Advent season, which is a desert experience of another kind. Unlike Lent, where the desert is obvious and clear, Advent beckons all of us to seek out a hidden desert, our inner desert, and the dry places in our spiritual lives that need to be worked out and made lush before December 25th Christmas Day. Beginning our journey towards Christmas, we have to be careful not to pay too much attention to the flashy decorations and nostalgic carols that threaten to rob us of the waiting time and rush us into a moment that is not yet here. We do that through the rhythm of Advent, a season that challenges us to slow down even as the drumbeat of commercial Christmas pounds on its 'Hurry, Hurry!' warning. This is a time of silence, darkness, waiting and watching, surrender and trust. As we light our first Advent candle this weekend may the Lord bless each one of us with the gift of patience in making this a special season for heart and soul. Happy Advent - Happy New Church Year to you. Gift yourself with the beautiful Sacrament of Confession this Advent.

BROKEN ENGLISH AT MASS!

They rejected his generous offer and opted to leave things as they are. I find that awfully disappointing. I for one struggle with the present translation with its convoluted syntax.
