**SENIOR BADMINTON:** resumes on Monday night Sept 17<sup>th</sup> at 8pm. New members welcome.

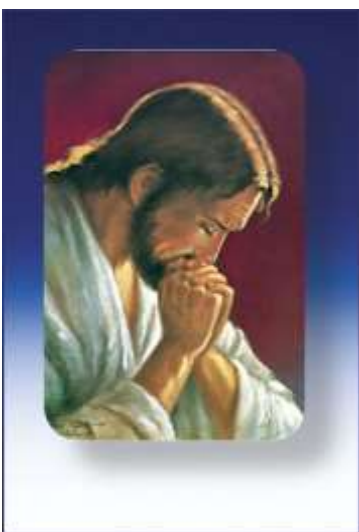

## **WHO IS JESUS?**



The question 'WHO IS JESUS?' is the underlying one behind the beautiful stories in the Gospel. This weekend that question is asked explicitly. As your P.P. now for over 38 months, I have to ask myself what kind of Jesus I have placed before you in that length of time. Going back to the early Christian communities, the answer to this question was the fact that Jesus died, apparently a failure, abandoned by his close friends and companions, and perhaps even by God. His subsequent delightful and loving presence among the group of Disciples that abandoned Him is described by a number of terms in the New Testament.....RESURRECTION, EXALTATION, GLORIFICATION. So who is Jesus to you? After life here and after death would you love to meet and stay with him forever? Yes! I hear you say! - great, then you know what you have to do - meet, greet and experience him in Vigil or Sunday Eucharist. You are most welcome to come as you are and not as you would like to be and hear Jesus ask you softly and tenderly "who am I" ?

## **HOW CLEAN IS YOUR HEART?**

Sin is not only outside us but also inside us. It is the heart. How can one describe and sum up the heart. Darkness of heart is the blackest of all.
