IS IT DIFFICULT ADVICE?

In one of my 'FIRST FRIDAY' calls recently I had the privilege of looking through the personal notebook, which my friend had inherited from an elderly Aunt many years ago. Amongst the variety of prayers and quotations that the Aunt had collected, this one was heavily underlined: Pause before you speak and ask yourself:

IS IT TRUE? IS IT KIND? IS IT NECESSARY?

It is brief and to the point and oh what a lot of trouble could be prevented if more of us decided to follow that advice. It is difficult advice?

MISSION SUNDAY

Someone said even the devil can quote scripture for his own ends. Have we ever been like the terribly tempered Lucy in the "Peanuts" comic strip? Lucy comes into the room where Linus is watching television. He says to her, "I was here first so I get to watch what I want". Without a word, Lucy marches to the television and flips the channel to her programme. Linus protests, "Hey!" Assuming her best know-it-all stance, Lucy says, "In Matthew's Gospel it says: 'Many that are first will be last and the last first'. Linus's response was, "I'll bet Matthew didn't have an older sister!" Wouldn't it be sad if we were ever to quote Scripture more for show than for truth? This is Mission Sunday where we are encouraged to help in making the Gospel and values of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit known by the way we live our own lives. We are asked to pray for all who are Missionaries. Secondly, we are asked to be generous in today's second collection. Our donations go to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, which will distribute all money collected equally toward spreading the Gospel worldwide. Let us be challenged this Mission Sunday in spreading the Gospel at home, but also by our prayers and financial support in ensuring that it continues to be heard right across the world.

MISSION POSSIBLE

We live with more noise today than our predecessors. Sound abounds wherever we are. Technology intrudes. Some even opt for noisy isolation with their personal stereo. The world of nature plays to an increasingly unaware and unheeding audience. But God's way of communicating does not seek to shout or clamour loudly for our attention, like a teacher in some unruly class. Those who seek God are more likely to find him in solitude. Where can we find that peace and solitude? The wave of Irish Monks who swept across Europe in the seventh century went in search of solitude. They journeyed far but they also journeyed within - a far deeper and uncharted journey. Perhaps it accounts for their extraordinary success as Missionaries. The Church paid its own compliment to the contribution of such hermits when it chose St. Therese, a convent bound contemplative as the patroness of the Missions. Therese Martin entered the Carmelite Convent at the age of 15 and died in 1897 at the age of 24. She is a wonderful example to all of us - her 'little way' of being open to God's will, living from moment to moment and doing ordinary things extraordinarily well.

"SENT FORTH!"
