DON'T BE TROUBLED! "PEACE I LEAVE YOU"

Some people have an awful lot of anger inside them, for whatever reason. The result is that much of life becomes a misery for them. They enjoy very little peace of mind or serenity of soul. Robbed of so much, they stumble along, blindly unaware that the roots of their unhappiness lie inside themselves. But then you meet other people who, in spite of their hardships and difficulties have this inner peace and what a difference it makes to their lives and indeed the lives of others. There is an old story about two neighbours, James and Miko, ploughing in adjacent fields. The ground was hard and stony which meant the work was difficult. A hot sun beat down on them with the result that sweat ran down their faces. The air was full of flies and with both hands on the plough it was difficult to keep them at bay. It certainly was no picnic. Though it was exactly the same for both men they reacted very differently.

BLACK MOOD

James was in a black mood. He was thinking of how hard the work was and about the pain in his arms and legs. His horse would not go as fast as he wanted him to go so he lashed out at him again and again with his whip. The beatings only had the effect of making the horse more stubborn and uncooperative. And to crown it all every time James looked across at Miko in the next field, he got the impression that he was laughing at him. This made him even angrier. He was completely oblivious to the singing of the birds and the bleating of the lambs. Nor had he eyes for the beauty which Spring had bestowed on the surrounding countryside. The work was hard but his mood was not making it any easier. He was full of anger and resentment. Even though at the end of the day he had finished the work, he derived no satisfaction from it. As he headed for home he experienced a terrible weariness of body and spirit. It was not work that was to blame but his own agitated state. Agitation is a symptom of the inner confusion of a soul without peace.

CALM AND SERENE

Miko, on the other hand, was in a calm and serene mood. He worked quietly and well in spite of the pains and aches. Every now and then he stopped to give his horse a rest. While doing so he would look behind him at the work he had done. It was good work. The sight of it encouraged him to keep going and the horse responded to his gentle promptings with an even pull. As he worked Miko's heart was lightened by the beauty that Spring had brought. He looked across at his neighbour. He bore him no ill-will but he could see he was in a very agitated state. He would have liked to help him but he knew that when he was in such foul mood it was better to leave him alone. When Miko had the job done he felt good. He patted the horse on the side of the neck and gave him some grain to eat. As he headed for home he was weary in body but felt happy and at peace with the world. How do you account for the difference between the two neighbours? It was not in the outer circumstances but in their inner attitudes. Miko had inner peace, James was in turmoil, he held onto inner anger which spoiled life for him and for others around him. At this time of your life who do you identify with most - James or Miko? Are you troubled or at peace?
