JESUS IN THE PARISH?

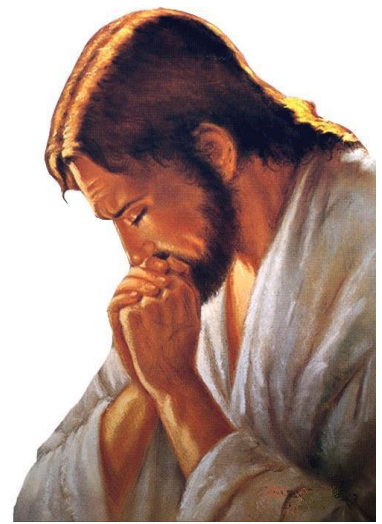
Have you ever wondered what it would be like to have Jesus as a parishioner here in our Parish?
