

AS ANOTHER LENT STARTS THIS WEDNESDAY ASH WEDNESDAY - A CHALLENGE FOR ALL::::

TO LOOK AND ACT LIKE JESUS

I love the old legend which records how Jesus was once sitting with His friends around a fire in the street. John, that beloved disciple, took a piece of charcoal and traced the outline of his Master's shadow where it was thrown on the wall of a house. Next day, many people stopped to inspect the outline and guess who it represented.

One man pointed to the crooked back and thought it depicted a shoemaker; others thought it had the likeness of a fruit seller. Along came a learned Pharisee who though it was like himself - with the fine brow of a thinker. Then came a poor and very humble man with a strong tender face, kind eyes and a beautiful smile. He examined the outline closely and said, "Oh, if only I could look like that! But that would be impossible". But as he stood there, the crowd hushed and drew back, pointing to him. For, without knowing it, the stranger did resemble the picture. He had lived a good life and so he had come to look like Jesus.

Six weeks of lent are now ahead of us. It can be a time of growth and change. Lent calls us to live and look like Jesus. May He help all of our efforts during this up and coming joyful season of Lent.

FASTING AND FEASTING:

Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. Fasting means that the amount of food we eat is considerably reduced. Traditionally, a fast means confining ones eating to one meal and two small snacks. Abstinence means that we do not eat meat on Ash Wednesday or Good Friday and give up a particular kind of food or drink or make another appropriate sacrifice during the forty days of Lent. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 60 is bound by the law of fasting. All those over 14 are bound by the law of abstinence. And for all the other days of lent Fast and Feast!



Fast from criticism and Feast on praise.
Fast from self-pity and Feast on joy.
Fast from ill-temper and Feast on contentment.
Fast from jealously and Feast on humility
Fast from selfishness and Feast on service.
Fast from fear and Feast on faith.
Enjoy your Fasting and Feasting for Lent 2016.



LET US NEVER BE PUT OFF BY OUR WEAKNESSES:

Our three readings this weekend have the same idea and are very encouraging. We are dealing with three men who did great things for God; Isaiah, Paul and Peter. Yet, strange as it may seem, all three of them suffered from inferiority complex, none of them were volunteers in the sense of offering themselves spontaneously. They were all called by God. They accepted that call somewhat reluctantly, feeling they were unworthy of it. Isaiah, when called by God cried out: "I am not fit for such a task; I am a man of unclean lips". Paul worked violently against the Church in his early days. He said "Of all followers of Christ I am the least, in fact I do not deserve the name Christian". And poor Peter after a miraculous catch of fish declared: "Lord depart from me for I am a sinful man". Each of them starts by acknowledging their unworthiness, inadequacy and sinfulness but all end up by accepting God's invitation. They rely not on their own resources but on God's forgiveness, love, kindness and help. And as a result, each did a splendid job. This Lent in our Parish, we can change and respond, like Isaiah, Paul and Peter. With God's help we will.
