BELIEVE!

While John's Mum had been suffering from chronic heart failure for some time, the family took it for granted that she would be around indefinitely. When John received the news that she had died, it was a strange sensation. Nothing mattered except the fact that she was dead. All the normal reference points disappeared, to be replaced by the central realization that what had been the most important referent - Mum - was now a memory without a physical or geographic location. It was an unexpected sense of being orphaned, of being cut loose from his moorings at the age of fifty-five, of having lost the one who had always been an absolute. John felt a profound grief from deep within, not just from behind the eyes as seen in the movies. Through all of this, John's experience of faith was different too. It went beyond feeling "sadder but wiser" to hit at the core of things for John, the question was: "Do I have any faith at all, or is what appears to be my beliefs simply the echo of Mum and Dad's faith? As long as my parents were alive, faith by proxy was possible. We could afford to jokingly indulge Mum's all-encompassing faith - she had enough for all of us", exclaimed John. But suddenly, John is on his own. There is a huge void with nothing to fill it but ones own faith. At the funeral Mass, in one of the readings - St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians - the three things that last are "Faith, Hope and Love and the greatest of these is Love!" Although the foundations of John's faith had been shaken, I knew in my heart that John will have the surety of his Mum's love, beckoning him to believe and to have faith like hers. I know John believes this too. Have you made a journey from doubt to faith in your own life? What makes it hard for you to have faith? Think of who or what helps you to strengthen your convictions. The disciples these Easter days are moving from doubt to faith, may we do the same!

STRANGER ON THE SHORE

Nobody likes to fail. The Apostles had failed, but the 'Stranger on the shore' got them to say, "We caught nothing - we failed". If we can say these words in the presence of someone we trust, then suddenly failure loses its power over us. It is sometimes easier to say them to a sympathetic stranger than a to a friend or family member. Then the Stranger told them to let down the net once more. They did this and made a large catch of fish. This shows that even when Jesus is only a shadowy figure in the margins of our lives, we are still ok if we do what He asks of us. But once Peter recognized the Stranger he wanted to encounter Him, he wanted to be near Him. There is a world of difference between those who have encountered the Risen Jesus and those who obey a Stranger. The Risen Jesus nourishes those who encounter Him and He gives them a task to do. He says to them: "Feed my lambs, feed my sheep". Still in the beautiful Easter season may all of us be honest and faithful in putting Gospel values into practice. Let us encourage one another is this privileged task. May our weaknesses not hinder us is being Easter People.
