THE SAINTS, OUR DECEASED AND US

"She has her mother's eyes". "He is the spitting image of his father". From birth until death, we talk endlessly about family resemblances. We carry within us the traits of our ancestors. There are other characteristics, we'll say: "He has the patience of Job". "I wish I had my grandmother's faith". "She's a saint for doing that". "He's a prayerful person". These qualities and traits come from our spiritual ancestors, our deceased and Saints. They share with us the common bond of God's image. We also share the common bond of our Baptism. In our Christian Catholic tradition we believe that on the day of our Baptism the very life of God came to dwell within us, not just for one or ten or one hundred years, but forever. We also believe that at that very moment we became members of God's family. So, in Baptism, like the first creation, we are linked together; living and dead. Our Baptism calls us to model our lives on the life and message of Jesus as He left in all the Gospels. Each of us too leaves a story for others to tell. We look back for inspiration to the stories of the Saints and Apostles from the early Church. This coming week as we celebrate the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls, we might ask ourselves what we will leave behind? What will people remember of our lives? How will we mirror the very life, image and likeness of God that we see reflected in our deceased relative and Saints of the Church?
