#### THE GREAT GIFT FOR LIFE

This is the Fifth and final week of Lent 2017. In our Gospel this weekend we witness a scene which is all too common in our world - people crying over the death of a loved one. Jesus is at the heart of this sad scene, for it is His good friend Lazarus who is dead. Jesus cries and He raises Lazarus to life. People who have come out of a coma or who have recovered from serious illness or accident have a somewhat similar experience. Life is given back to them. How precious life appears to such as these. All seems a grace, a blessing, and a miracle. These people know how Lazarus felt. Against all the odds they wake, come round and begin to recognise their loved ones once again. It is an experience akin to being re-born. However, this weekend's Gospel story speaks not just to these but to us all. Each morning we wake from the little death of sleep to renewed life. Life is such a precious thing but, alas, how often we tend to take it for granted. If daily we receive and acknowledge life as a gift from God, we will never cease to be amazed at its wonder and mystery.

There is, however, much more to the story of the rising of Lazarus than adding a few extra years to his earthly life. What is really at stake is eternal life. Jesus is the source of eternal life for all who believe in Him. He came so that we might have life and have it to the full, hear and hereafter. Here is a prayer seeking God's help for us to appreciate and value the great gift of life.

"O Loving God, I ask you to be with me this day. I don't know what lies ahead of me, but I pray to you to help me discern the path you wish me to follow. Help me to see clearly the things that matter and those that don't. Help me to use fully every gift I have remembering that it is from you. May the spirit of God give me a generous and open heart, making me an instrument of peace and love in whatever choices I make. Help me to use these last days of lent well and make good positive choices in everything I do. Amen".
