THINKING OF JESUS

Among the very thoughts I have of Jesus in Holy Week what leaps to mind is Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane drinking the cup of loneliness. His soul torn with awful sorrow at His impending death, He looks about for His disciples, seeking a little warmth and human support and they are sleeping. All these good and fine people with whom He had shared His thoughts. Now in this moment of unbearable agony in which He is so openly and wholly human, He turns to these companions, hoping to find comfort and support in any word or gesture on their part but they are not with Him. From my days all those years ago in National School in Cooraclare, this dreadful moment - His awful time in the Garden of Gethsemane, remains very vivid in my mind and heart. That memory draws me closer to Jesus especially in Holy Week. Can it do likewise for you?

LET IN GOD

I love this saying which goes as follows:

"The measure of what you can do for your Parish is the measure of what you let God do with you yourself". Holy Week is a great week to "let in God to your heart and life!" You will feel better if you do.

THIS IS HOLY WEEK

This Sunday marks the beginning of the most sacred week of the year for all Christians - Holy Week. We may know the facts of the story: the trial and the suffering of Jesus, but it doesn't mean that we know the heart of the story. Part of the problem may be that we know the account too well and it remains simply a pious story from the past. This week we can bring it alive and make it mean something. No matter how we may have spent these last five weeks, we can still make this final week truly special. Pray, read the scriptures and ask to know the story not only in your head but in your heart too. School holidays have started and with many planning Easter breaks, we might very easily forget about Jesus. May God Our Loving Father prompt and nudge us in giving time and presence in making this week holy. A grace filled Holy Week to one and all. Safety, blessings and joy to all on holidays. OUR BROTHER JUDAS DURING HOLY WEEK

You cannot get away from Judas in Holy Week. He is there on Palm Sunday in the Passion betraying Jesus with a kiss in the Garden of Gethsemane. On Monday, we find him complaining that the ointment Mary used to anoint the feet of Jesus is not sold and the money given to the poor. On Tuesday, he is there at the Last Supper, receiving from Jesus the piece of bread he had dipped and immediately going out to complete his treacherous plan. On Wednesday, we see Judas receiving thirty pieces of silver and then again at the Last Supper, we hear those dreadful words from Jesus "....better for man if he had never been born". On Holy Thursday at the beginning of the Gospel of the washing of the feet, we are reminded again that Judas planned to betray Jesus, prompted by the devil. It shows the awful destructive power of the devil which we all need to be aware of in these present times. While all four Evangelists might have different bits of news on Judas, but the one central fact they and all of us cannot doubt is that Jesus was betrayed by a so called friend, one of the twelve, chosen specifically by Jesus to be his companion. In recent times, different views have been put forward about Judas. One makes him out to be a devil, the ultimate in evil, while others view him as the predestined tool of providence and so unworthy of condemnation. Judas is there in the Passion story because he represents something in all of us. We betray Jesus. I always think that the thing that separates Peter from Judas was not so much the respective gravity of their sin, their betrayal of Jesus, but rather that Peter was there on Easter Sunday to receive our Lords forgiveness while Judas was not.
