

EASTER - A TIME TO ENCOURAGE EACH OTHER

Easter blessings to you all. A big thank you to all who made Holy Week so special and all the generous help and support I received with our Church celebrations. Thanks above all to those of you who continue to give me blessings and encouragement. Our Easter promise to Jesus should be that we would throughout this season of Eastertide, be people who give real encouragement. Dante Gabriel Rossetti, the famous 19th century poet and artist, was once approached by a man in his 80's. This elderly man had some sketches and drawings that he wanted Rossetti to look at and tell him if they were any good, or if they at least showed potential talent. Rossetti looked them over carefully after the first few he knew they were worthless, showing not the least sign of artistic talent. But Rossetti was a man full of kindness and he told the elderly man as gentle as possible that the sketches and drawings were without much value and showed little talent. He was sorry but he could not lie to the man. The old man was very disappointed but seemed to except Rossetti's judgement. He then apologised for taking up Rossetti's time but would he just look at a few more drawings - those done by a young art student? Rossetti looked over the second batch of sketches and immediately became enthusiastic over the talent revealed. "These", he said, "Oh these are good. This young student has great talent. He should be given every help and encouragement in his career as an artist. He has a great future, if he will work hard and stick to it". Rossetti could see that the old man was deeply moved. "Who is the fine artist?" he asked. "Your son?" "No", said the old man with tears in his eyes. "It is me sixty years ago. If only I had heard the encouragement then. For, you see, I got discouraged and gave up too soon". So go on, be an Easter person prepared to encourage. There are so very many in our own Parish and indeed in all Parishes who need encouragement. Will you be the person to give it?



THE WORD EASTER

The word 'Easter' derives from Eostre, the pagan goddess of Spring and was normally associated with the month of April. But Easter Sunday, nowadays, is the first Sunday after the first full moon following 21st March and can, therefore, fall as early as 22nd March or as late as 25th April. The rebirth of the country side and Resurrection of Jesus both have to do with newness of life. Enjoy that newness of life these beautiful Easter days. You are in my Masses and prayers.
