LAXITY AND CARELESSNESS IN REGARDING MORALITY AND WORSHIP

The Prophet Malachi attacks the laxity and carelessness that have set in regarding morality and worship. He specifically takes the Priests to task, berating them for not living up to their calling and thus being responsible for the erosion of faith among the people. This observation made all those years ago by Prophet Malachi, might it be made in modern day Ireland? In this weekend's Gospel we see how strong Jesus was in His criticism of those who use religion to gain spiritual power and who do not live in what is at the heart of religion - LOVE, COMPASSION, JUSTICE AND FAITH. Matthew, in his Gospel that we reflect on this weekend applies it to Christian leaders, who are in danger of repeating the mistakes of the Pharisees. Make no mistake about it; the message is as relevant now as it was back then. Religious office holders are still reluctant to let go of ostentatious dress, places of honour, titles and so on, which are contrary to the spirit of the Gospel. Jesus had some harsh criticism to make on the religious leaders of His time (Priests and Bishops). He called them hypocrites, because they didn't practise what they had preached. Which of us can truthfully say that our deeds match our words? Therefore, to some extent, all of us are hypocrites. Each time we celebrate Holy Eucharist (Mass) we are called, loved and appreciated by God to a life of truth and genuine goodness. November is a lovely month to come to Eucharist with an honest and humble heart, looking for God's blessings and help in marking our deeds match our words.

OUTWARD SHOW

A peacock's feathers are very colourful. However, they are worn more for show than for warmth. The Pharisees wore their virtue for show; they wanted to be seen and praised by others. They were more concerned with APPEARING to be good than with really BEING good. Today there is great emphasis on appearance. The image is more important that the reality. We may deceive others but we cannot deceive God, so it would be foolish even to try. We don't have to put on an outward show or pretend to be what we are not. All we have to do is try to be true to what we are - God's sons and daughters. Lord, help us to shun all falsity and pretence, and to live a life of genuine goodness. Then our deeds will flow from what we are as naturally as good fruit from a good tree.
