WHAT WILL MATTER?

Ready or not, some day all will come to an end. There will be no more sunrises, no minutes, hours or days. All the things you collected whether treasured or forgotten will pass to somebody else. Your wealth, fame and temporal power will shrivel to irrelevance. It will not matter what you owned or what you were owed. Your grudges, resentments, frustrations and jealousies will disappear. So, too, your hopes, ambitions, plans and to-do list will expire. The wins and losses that once seemed so important will fade away. It won't matter where you came from or what area you lived in. It won't matter whether you were beautiful or brilliant. Even your gender and skin colour will be irrelevant. So what will matter? How will the value of your days be measured? What will matter is not what you bought but what you built. Not what you got but what you gave. What will matter is not your success but your significance. What will matter is not what you learned but what you taught. What will matter is every act of integrity, compassion, courage or sacrifice that enriched, empowered or encouraged others to emulate your example. What will matter is not you competence but your character. What will matter is not how many people you knew but who will feel a lasting loss when you are gone. What will matter is not your memories but the memories of those who loved you. What will matter is how long you will be remembered by whom and for what. Living a life that matters doesn't happen by accident. It's not a matter of circumstance but choice. Choose a life that matters. Over to you!

THE MOST IMPORTANT VOTE YOU WILL EVER BE ASKED TO MAKE

On Friday next the 25th all of us with the right to vote will have to make the decision whether to retain or repeal the 8th Amendment. It will probably be the most important vote any of us will ever be asked to make Article 40 of our Constitution has the 'Personal Rights' and is situated in a section entitled 'Fundamental Rights'. The deletion or amendment of Article 40 - 3.3 will withdraw the right to life from some categories of unborn children. To do so will radically change the principle for all unborn children and indeed for all of us, that the right to life is a fundamental human right. The Church believes that the distinct identity of a human individual is present once conception has taken place. Everything else is simply the process of growth and development of a person who has already embarked on the journey of life.

The issue of 'choice' is central to the public discourse on the 8th Amendment, the right of the mother to choose an abortion or not. The mother's choice is fundamental and has to be respected, but we must consider and ask the question whether the baby in the womb who is without a voice, should also have a choice about life? On Friday 25th we will be left with a choice, to retain or repeal the 8th Amendment. Choice is never easy and Robert Frost's poem comes to mind entitled "THE ROAD NOT TAKEN" The last verse goes as follows:

"I shall be telling this with a sigh somewhere ages and ages hence:
Two roads diverged in a wood and I took the one less travelled by, and that has made all the difference"

The road we choose on the 25^{th} has the power to make all the difference. May the Lord guide all of us with His wisdom and love to choose the right road.

PENTECOST

The word 'Pentecost' means 'fiftieth day' was the name given to the Feast of Weeks in the Jewish calendar because it fell on the fiftieth day after the Passover. In the Christian tradition, it was applied to the Feast of the decent of the Holy Spirit because this event is portrayed as occurring fifty days after Easter Sunday. After Easter it has been described as the second festival of the Church. Pentecost marks the close of Eastertide. 'Come Holy Spirit' where truth, love, goodness, peace, kindness, wisdom, courage, patience and many other of his fruits are present. There the Holy Spirit is active. May He continue to bless us.
